### **Capital Improvement Projects Happening in Rohnert Park**

**Rohnert Park, CA (July 21, 2023)** – On July 11, Rohnert Park City Council approved four additional projects and changes of funding for two existing projects. City Council also approved a five-year CIP through Fiscal Year (FY) 27-28. Some of these projects include improving Sunrise Park courts and other on-site improvements. It also includes preplanning activities to complete traffic improvements in support of the casino expansion and design work to start addressing the building condition needs of 62 city-owned facilities.

“We intend to use our assets to address infrastructure needs and provide greater attention to City facilities,” said Mayor Samantha Rodriguez. “These projects are essential to improving safety, providing valuable services and enhancing quality of life to our residents.”

Additionally, Rohnert Park City Council approved a majority of projects for FY 23-24 CIP in June. The city plans to complete more than \$30.1 million in capital projects from various special revenue sources in FY 23-24.

The following infrastructure improvements for FY 23-24 include:

- **Park maintenance:**
  - Downtown Site Conceptual Design
  - Ladybug Park Pool Buildings Demolition
  - Park Bench and Shade Structure Replacement
  - Trail to Crane Creek Regional Park
  - Sunrise Park and Magnolia Park Improvements
- **Streets maintenance and improvements:**
  - Various Streets Pavement Management
  - Pothole Repair Maintenance
  - Sidewalk Replacement Program
  - Traffic Improvements to Major Corridors along Golf Course Drive and Rohnert Park Expressway
- **City facilities:**
  - Building Major Repairs and Replacements

- Public Works Corporation Yard Conceptual Design
- Health and Human Services Hub Creation
- General Plan Update
  
- **Sewer maintenance:**
  - Sewer Line Replacement on A section
  - Pump Station Mechanical Projects
  
- **Water maintenance:**
  - Southwest Boulevard Water Line Replacement
  - Water Meter Replacements

Capital improvement projects will be financed primarily through user fees, sales tax measures like gas tax, special taxes and agreements.

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
